## HOW YOUR MONEY IS SPENT



The donations received for young Joshua Muller and totalling Rs.168,990 were sent to the family in addition to Rs.15,000 comprising his welfare benefits for the second quarter and the mid-year Bonus. The following is a letter received from his grandmother, Mrs. Yvonne Muller and brought to tears to my eyes:

#### Dear Sir,

At the moment, Joshua and I are down with fever, cold and cough (flu). With the money you sent, I took medicine for me and Joshua. Thank you very much, otherwise we wont have money to take medicine. I would have had to go to others to ask for money to buy medicine. Thanks for the help. I am very thankful and gratefully appreciated the help you all have given to me. I have never got such a sum of money, never in my life. God will bless each and every one of you for your great kindness. We have been suffering in silence. There are days that we had to starve with no way of buying food or milk for my little grandson. I am always praying to Jesus to help us. This is a miracle when I got this

money and tears filled my eyes because no one had ever helped me. I bought some things which Joshua needed. Whenever I take Joshua to the Clinic, I had to go in a three-wheeler because I cannot carry him to go in a bus. When I dont have anything to cook I used to sit and cry my heart out when I think of Joshua. He does not know anything. He can only say 'Amma' and 'Hungry'. I cannot think what I am to do. If anyone can come, they can see with their own eyes how we are living. God is good.

I have bought Cologne because when Joshua gets fits I have got to wet his head with it. I have bought butter, cheese and some clothes for him. I have bought everything that is needed for Joshua. I am very careful with the money because I know the suffering we are undergoing. Now I know that I can give Joshua what he needs. Thank you, very much. God bless you all for helping a poor grandmother.

#### THE ECM STUDENT SPONSORSHIP SCHEME

The sponsorship program was originally started in 1984; and was operated by Maurice Forster outside the umbrella of the ECM. The scheme was totally independent both financially and administratively of the club because of taxation rules relating to Charities which precluded payments for educational purposes. When the Commonwealth Government included educational assistance as an acceptable form of charity for tax exemption purposes the Student Sponsorship Program became a part of the activities of the ECM. The scheme has grown since its inception and now forms a very important part of the ECM's activities.

There are two geographically distinct areas of activity with one in Colombo and the surrounding areas coordinated on the Club's behalf by the Dutch Burgher Union (DBU) in Combo and the other in the Eastern Province coordinated by the Burgher Union Batticaloa (BUB).

# The aim of the scheme is *"To improve the economic standing of the Burgher community in Sri Lanka; which has one of the highest levels of unemployment of all communities in S.L. -by providing financial support for education and the development of employment related skills in the children of Burgher parents."*

Selections are made after interview of the student and parents by the DBU or BUB. Application forms and details received in Melbourne are again examined by the ECM Program Coordinator before being discussed with the prospective sponsor who makes the final choice. The cost of sponsorship of a child is \$60 per quarter which increases to \$75 a quarter if the student commences Advanced Level classes or tertiary education.

At present there are a total of 191 children being assisted by the generous contributions of sponsors from Australia and overseas. Colombo has 157 and Batticaloa has 34 students under sponsorship. While most students seek employment on completion of the GCE "O" Level examination others go on to "A" Level classes or some form of technical training, with a few continuing on to University. In all cases the students who have completed their education have emerged better equipped for their future because of the assistance the sponsorship afforded them.

There have been some outstanding successes with one student graduating from Medical College another completed a Double Degree in Geography and English with honours. The most recent tertiary graduate was a boy from Batticaloa who completed a BSc Hons. Degree in Town and Country Planning from the Faculty of Architecture. While these are certainly excellent results there are numerous students who have obtained gainful employment in the Banking, Tourist, Hospitality, and Government and Mercantile sectors.
