### FROM THE DESK OF THE EDITOR

From time to time we are confronted with real tragedies where families are desperate for help because the breadwinner has been struck down suddenly and his dependants have no one to turn to but the Eighty Club. The latest case is one concerning Mr. John Edward Fernando, married to Bianca nee Outschoorn. They have two children, both of whom are sponsored through this Club.

On a day in July, Mr Fernando was riding his bicycle to give his daughter a lift back from a tuition class. On the way, he was knocked down by a car and rushed to hospital with severe head injuries. After surgery, he was declared 50% brain dead and sent home a 'vegetable.' He just lies there, immobile, with his wife having to do everything for him. He is nasal fed and the prognosis is that he could continue to live in this manner indefinitely. Luckily his mother-in-law lives with them and can assist in his care. One can imagine the plight Bianca found herself in. Her husband leaves the house to bring back their daughter and comes home a wreck who cannot speak, move or otherwise help himself. She came to the DBU and told the welfare staff about her plight and they brought the case to our notice. Immediately, we gave them a pension which would give them an income of Rs.15,000 per guarter and help to keep the home fires burning. The sponsorship of both their children also helped. For obvious reasons, Bianca is unable to go out and work.

This is another sad case similar to that of Mr Stanley de Fry who was in an accident while driving his three-wheeler and was sent home with brain damage, totally unconscious and helpless. When I described this case in the newsletter, many members rallied round with spontaneous donations which helped his wife, Nilmini, get on her feet and re-organise her life. Mr de Fry has since passed away and the family are faring well with a pension being paid to the widow by the Eighty Club.

Our members are never slow to open their hearts and their wallets in these cases and is one reason why I am proud to be a member of the Eighty Club.

### PRESIDENTS REPORT JUNE 2014

They say that all good things must come to an end and this being the end of my sixth year as President of our great Club, I will not be seeking re-election as I feel it is time to step aside and make way for new blood. We have maintained the number of Less Fortunate People we support in Sri Lanka at 215. These Beneficiaries are paid a monthly stipend of Rupees 3000 per month and, where appropriate, a Spouse allowance of Rs 1000 and a Family Allowance of Rs 1000. In addition a Christmas Bonus of Rs 2000 and a Mid-year Bonus of Rs 3000 were also paid. This has only been made possible due to the continued support of all our members, friends and benefactors who not only attend our regular functions, but make very generous donations throughout the year.

Your support and encouragement is greatly appreciated and is the inspiration for all on our committee to keep pressing on. The majority of our Committee members have been serving in this capacity for over 10 years.

I am dedicating this report to thanking all those generous and kind hearted people who through their generosity and willingness to help, have made my task a real pleasure.

Firstly and most importantly to all our Members, Friends, and Benefactors a very big Thank You. Your continued support is what helps this Club to meet its obligations.

To the de Silva family, Lorraine, Victor, Shanaka and Krishan you are a one of a very rare kind. Over the past 15 years these fine folk have donated in excess of \$100,000 and continue to do so. Personally, I have found it a great pleasure to deal with you all on a professional and most importantly on a social level. Thank you very much for your assistance and advice over the past six years.

My thanks also to Padmini and Bala Mahedran for the donation of clothes for the needy in Sri Lanka and the donation of their delicious hors-d`oeuvres provided for our Christmas Dance.

Arleen and Bertie Ekanaike have agreed to sponsor the band for our December Dance and have also donated a number of raffle prizes over the year - your generosity is greatly appreciated.

I would like us to remember those members who have passed away. Bequests to our Club by families of those who have passed away are very welcome and go a long way in helping to meet future obligations. Thank you to all these families who remembered the less fortunate during their hour of sadness.

As usual, our regular lunches and the annual dance were very well supported and I thank the patrons of these functions and the caterers who contribute in no small measure by providing not only very tasty and sumptuous meals but at a very reasonable cost.

A special Thanks to Mazhar and Melanie Rauff, who have been the caterers at the majority of our lunches, for their benevolence. You have been more than generous with your pricing and donations.

Our Christmas Dance will be held, once again, at The Grand on Cathies Lane on the 6th of December. Please continue to support this function which is the jewel in the crown as far as our functions are concerned. Please book early to avoid disappointment.

To all the members of our very hard working committees of Management and Fund Raising, Thank You for your selflessness and dedication to the cause. Without you our Club could not exist. The Good Lord will reward you for the sacrifices you make.

Not many of us appreciate the volume of work our Treasurer, Tony Scarnivel and Assistant Treasurer Melville Knower, are required to perform. Every year, in excess of 600 invoices have to be forwarded and then receipts issued on payment. Quarterly invoices for Student sponsorship have also to be processed. In addition, Melville has the unenviable task of following up those Sponsors who are in arrears. Please ensure that Student sponsorship payments are kept up to date as these students rely on these funds to pay their school fees. Tony and Melville, your untiring efforts have made my job as President very enjoyable. Our search for new members continues and I ask you to assist us by recommending our organisation to friends and relatives. Our hardworking and dedicated Membership Secretary, June Isaaks, who also doubles as the MC at our functions, is ever ready to provide any information - A very big Thank you to June.

I am certain that each and every one of you look forward to receiving our very entertaining and informative Newsletter. To produce a document such as this is no easy task and is made all the more onerous by virtue of the fact that our Editor soldiers on in spite of having to undergo Dialysis three days a week and has had to endure other medical problems as well. Darryl! Your efforts are greatly appreciated and provide a lot of entertainment and information to all members. Darryl also is the Welfare Coordinator responsible for maintaining, assessing and coordinating payments to the 215 needy friends in Sri Lanka. Words are not enough to thank you for your efforts. Keep up the Great work. June and your support over the past 6 years is much appreciated.

The Student Sponsorship scheme continues to prosper and grow under the tutelage of Trevor Collette, Thanks Trevor for your friendship, help and advice throughout the year. Prompt payment of sponsorship is appreciated as these children depend on these funds to keep their education going.

Esther and Melville Knower have very graciously agreed to help Tony and Trevor with a number of very onerous administrative tasks, a special Thank you from me.

To our Web Master and Good friend, Earle Ferdinand, Thanks again and the club would be unable to function as smoothly without your valued input.

### "A Measure of the Divine in Us"

Is this the shrunken end to which we have brought ourselves? Is this the distance we want between us and life, now that we know how wonderful life is really meant to be?

Forgiveness puts life back together again. It is proof of our own learnings. It is a sign of our own inner healing. It is a mark of our own self-knowledge. It is the measure of the divine in us.
