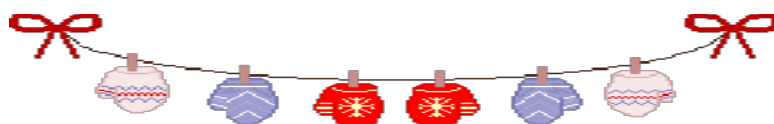

HOW YOUR MONEY IS SPENT

Welfare Beneficiaries, Bianca Winslow and Francis Matthysz passed away and were replaced by Rosemary Patternott and Joseph Lodiwycksz

The total number of beneficiaries is now 215 and each one will be paid a bonus of Rs.3000 at the end of the year. The Club is paying Rs.2000 per beneficiary but a very generous donor, who wishes to remain anonymous has paid the difference to make it Rs.3000 per head. What a wonderfully giving gesture for which we thank her.

The following were helped from the Emergency Fund:

Rs.2000 to Hilda Holmes. She and her husband are in their sixties with no income and a dilapidated home.

Rs.1000 to Nora Robertson. No income and no place to stay. Is looking for a job.

Rs.1000 to E T Lappen who is a welfare beneficiary but needed some money for medication.

Rs.3000 to Wilma Ferdinands. Is a welfare beneficiary who is very ill and had to enter hospital.

Rs.2000 to Princy Baldsing. Has a bacterial infection in her leg and has to be hospitalised. No income and desperate.

Rs.1000 to Mrs Flora Roof. Welfare Beneficiary. Had nothing to eat that day.

Rs.1000 to Clark Vanderputt. His father was a welfare beneficiary and he has no income since the father died.

Rs.2000 to Clare de Zilwa. Welfare beneficiary who needed extra money for some medical tests.

Rs.2000 to Olga Rozairo. Has chronic filaria and needed money for medication.

Rs.1000 to Rosemary Martil who has no family and no income. Lives with a friend.

In the last issue of our newsletter I highlighted the plight of John Edward Fernando who was knocked down by a car while riding his bicycle on the way to bringing his daughter home from school. He was treated in hospital but sent home a 'vegetable' and lies immobile in bed unable to move or speak. The reaction from some of our members was immediate and we have been able to send this family a sum of Rs.50,850 which will help them with all the additional expenses brought about by John's condition. A further sum of \$1000 has been donated to the Fernando family by the same generous donor who topped up the Beneficiaries end of year bonus to Rs.3000. This money will help this family find a new home etc as they have been given notice by their present landlord. Our thanks to all who helped financially.

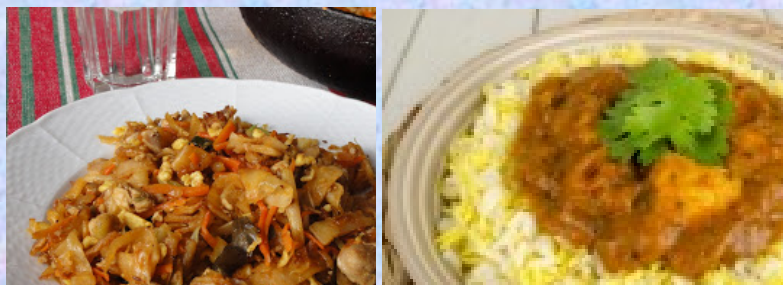

MORE INSTANCES OF HOW YOUR MONEY IS SPENT

This Club paid its 215 Welfare Beneficiaries their 4th quarter benefits on the 28th of October. Those who could come to the DBU were refreshed with a Fish Bun and a cup of tea each which they greatly appreciated. Beneficiaries were paid from Rs.3000 to Rs.5000 per month depending on their circumstances. These are families and individuals who have plumbed the depths of poverty and are living in very desperate circumstances. Their gratitude to this Club knows no bounds. One beneficiary came to collect her money on the way to her grandson's funeral. Another is suffering from throat cancer but still came to collect his 'pension'. Yet another beneficiary had a heart attack recently but came and collected her money. Last, but not least, one gent came all the way from Wattala on his motorised wheelchair as he is unable to walk. Just a few examples of how much these less fortunate folk depend on the money this Club pays them. At the end of the year, they will be paid a bonus of Rs.2000 each and the DBU will entertain them at a grand party at which they are usually given a hamper of provisions which they welcome.
