

#### TRIBUTE TO the late Darryl Isaaks 1934-2014

Darryl's commitment to helping the poor was second to none. From 2000, when he joined the Committee, he worked tirelessly to increase the number of families assisted by the Club and at every opportunity pushed for increasing the allowances to each family. When he joined me as Assistant Treasurer, he readily admitted he knew nothing of Debits and Credits, but that did not stop him from helping wherever possible. After a stint as Vice President he took over the Presidency in 2004 and for the next two years he threw himself whole heartedly into improving and running the Club.

After he stepped down from the Presidency he held the position of Welfare Beneficiary Coordinator, a post that was ideally suited to his sense of compassion and concern for the poor.

As the Club's Newsletter Editor he will be remembered for his editorials and the enjoyable manner that he communicated Club activities, information and articles of interest.

Unfortunately he battled a great many illnesses for a number of years. From high blood pressure in his early twenties to a quadruple heart bypass, prostate cancer, three hernia operations, arthritis and with a failing immune system and very poor appetite he had it all. The final blow was kidney failure for which he refused to go on Dialysis, but he answered the pleas of his family and from 2007 dragged himself to hospital 3 days a week and underwent 2 to 3 hours of Dialysis each time, after which June had to help him out of the car on some days as he was so weak. Finally when his strength failed and the doctors could no longer help, he had "had enough". With his loved ones close by, this man of compassion took his last breath on 6<sup>th</sup> December. All his pain is now gone and he rests in peace. He will be forever remembered.

The sponsorship program was originally started in 1984. The scheme has grown since its inception and now forms a very important part of the ECM's activities. There are two geographically distinct areas of activity with one in Colombo and the surrounding areas coordinated on the Club's behalf by the Dutch Burgher Union (DBU) in Combo and the other in the Eastern Province coordinated by the Burgher Union Batticaloa (BUB).

The aim of the scheme is "To improve the economic standing of the Burgher community in Sri Lanka; which has one of the highest levels of unemployment of all communities in S.L. -by providing financial support for education and the development of employment related skills in the children of Burgher parents."

Selections are made after interview of the student and parents by the DBU or BUB. Application forms and details received in Melbourne are again examined by the ECM Program Coordinator before being discussed with the prospective sponsor who makes the final choice. The cost of sponsorship of a child is \$60 per quarter which increases to \$75 a guarter if the student commences Advanced Level classes or tertiary education.

At present there are a total of 177 children being assisted by the generous contributions of sponsors from Australia and overseas. Colombo has 141 and Batticaloa has 36 students under sponsorship. While most students seek employment on completion of the GCE "O" Level examination others go on to "A" Level classes or some form of technical training, with a few continuing on to University.

In all cases the students who have completed their education have emerged better equipped for their future because of the assistance the sponsorship afforded them.

There have been some outstanding successes with one student graduating from Medical College another completing a Double Degree in Geography and English with honours. The most recent tertiary graduate was a boy from Batticaloa who completed a BSc Hons., Degree in Town and Country Planning from the Faculty of Architecture. While these are certainly excellent results there are numerous students who have obtained gainful employment in the Banking, Tourist, Hospitality, and Government and Mercantile sectors.
