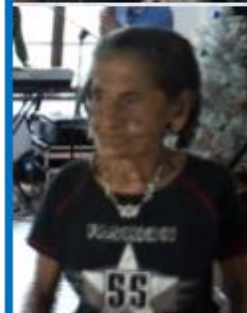
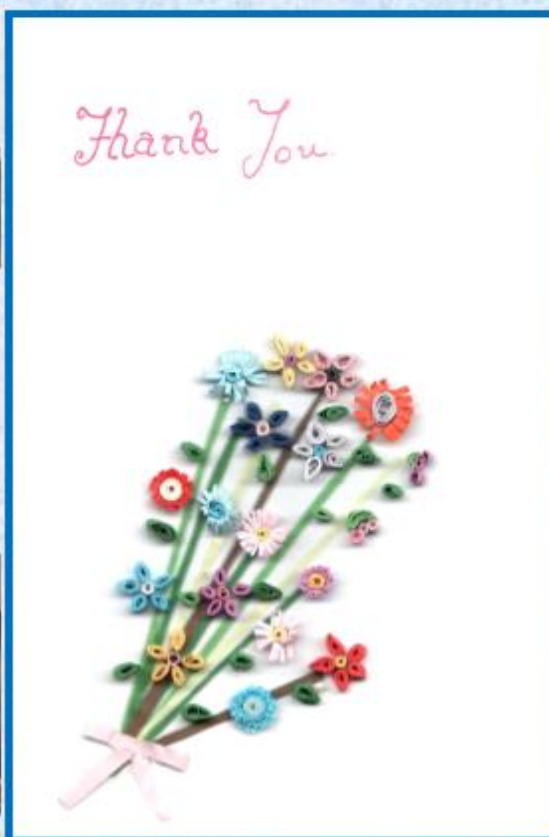

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Over the years, there have been many applications for assistance, both in the Welfare Beneficiary scheme and the Student Sponsorship scheme. The coordinators and the Management committee have the unenviable task of choosing the most deserving of these applications. It would be very easy indeed, to reach out and help all these deserving people, crying out for help.

However, together with the commitment to 'Care for the Less Fortunate', there is also the responsibility of continuing and sustaining our work, into the future.

Thanks to your generosity and goodwill, we have been able to fund and extend our vision to help those in need. Presently there are 215 welfare beneficiaries, receiving pensions / family allowances and a total of 174 sponsored students.

The extra funds generated by a favourable dollar to Rupee exchange rate in the past year proved beneficial and we were able to pay mid-year and Christmas bonuses. Also a very generous member donated an additional Rs.1000/= for every pensioner towards the Christmas bonus last year. The dollar however, has been on a roller coaster in recent months. The drop in the dollar has resulted in having to review our ability to fund a mid-year bonus this year. These are challenges we face and challenges we will work hard to resolve and overcome. We simply cannot fail those who depend on us and look towards us to help them in their time of need.

Recently I received a "Thank You" letter from one of our beneficiaries in Sri Lanka. It was a simple and yet powerful letter from the heart. A letter that brings a tear to your eyes and compels you to read it again to realize the pain, anguish and sorrow this lady had to bear every day in her life. She suffers with the reality of her life, that she is not able to offer a better life for her children. And yet, the words also resonate a heartfelt thanks to each and every one of you for having reached out to ease her burden and give help to her and her children and hope for a better life.

It epitomizes the fact that generosity has no borders. In reaching out to help a stranger, whose circumstances in life we probably will never know, is the greatest gesture of kindness and love we can offer our fellow human being. Perhaps we may not receive a word of thanks, but one thing we can be certain of, is that there will always be gratitude and a blessing in their hearts and thoughts. This letter, printed in this newsletter, is simple in its prose, yet emotive in its content.

It was also good to have feedback from a couple, about a student they had sponsored for many years. Anthea Muller - Chairperson, Social Welfare, DBU Sri Lanka



Anthea Muller the honorary Social Welfare Consultant of The Dutch Burgher Union in Colombo has retired after almost two decades of loving conscientious service to the community. The Eighty Club of Melbourne says a very deeply felt; *Thank you Anthea, for your kindness and care and for enabling us to fulfil our mission of helping the underprivileged members of the Burgher community in S.L.*

Anthea wrote at the time: "I felt honoured when in July 1998, the late Mr. Harold Speldewinde, then President proposed my name and I was unanimously elected to the new position of Social Welfare Consultant Dutch Burgher Union". The consultant's principle role was to look after the needy of the community in S.L. and this Anthea did with amazing sympathy, energy and magnetism – yes magnetism; because she attracted several others to join in alleviating hunger, suffering and homelessness in the needy of our community. I recall the times when Anthea even organised medical and eye-clinics with free consultations by caring practitioners and distributed medicines and spectacles

begged and cajoled from sympathetic donors.

Soon after the ECM asked the DBU to supervise our Student Sponsorship Program; a sponsor complained of never hearing from the student or parents. When told that the sponsorship would cease because of non communication. Anthea visited the family; far away from Colombo, and found a child who was deaf & dumb and a single mother (yes a Burgher) who was illiterate. This child's life was amazingly brightened when Anthea arranged and the sponsor paid for this child to be educated at the Deaf & Dumb School in Colombo - where she eventually learnt a trade. This is just one example of the care and interest with which Anthea worked tirelessly to assist and improve conditions for the unfortunate members of our community.

Anthea Muller; we are deeply impressed by your enthusiastic and caring efforts to bring comfort and hope to the beneficiaries and sponsored students of the ECM; long may you enjoy good health and happiness.

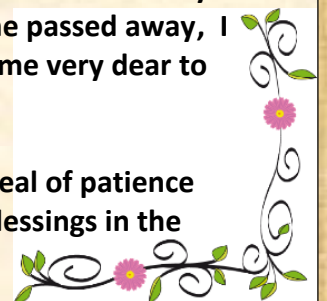
Our Very Dear Friend Anthea by June Isaaks

They each received Rs.9000 plus a Spouse Allowance and a family allowance for those with dependents.

Total amount distributed was Rs.2,096,250.00.

We are grateful to April and her team for the efficient and humane manner in which they organise the distribution of Eighty Club funds.

An emergency fund of Rs.20,000 is also provided to cater for contingency welfare callers who require assistance for their medical and other needs.

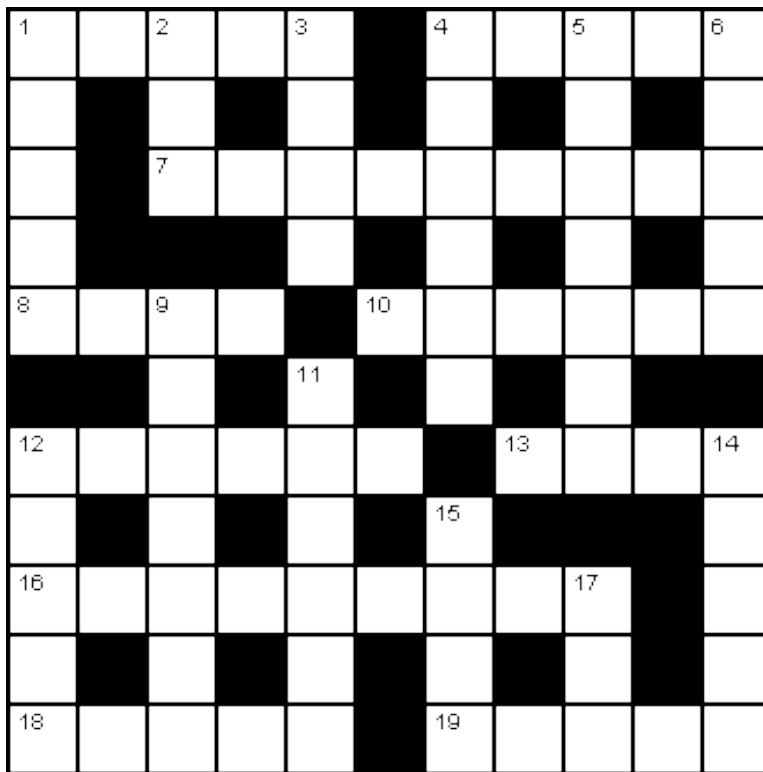
