There was no one she did not know. It was not uncommon for June to introduce herself to those she did not know and within a short time, she was their best friend. Her life was filled with challenges, triumphs, and opportunities and she touched the lives of so many people in her 80 years.

Her exuberance in meeting people and making friends, made her the best Membership Secretary, the Eighty Club Melbourne ever had. It will be hard to find someone, as

dedicated as June was in this role. Even with the onset of ill health, she tirelessly devoted long hours to the club and the work in hand. It was also fascinating to watch her at the club functions, to see this dimunitive lady waltz across the room meeting and greeting every guest. Her late husband Darryl, would sit quietly watching her and remark "Junee' is working the room". This was June in her element, with that remarkable memory for every face and every name.

June was also a person of remarkable strength. For years she had to watch the love of her life, her husband Darryl, battle kidney problems, and help him cope with dialysis. Her simple philosophy in life was to live it to the fullest and give it everything she could. Losing Darryl, her husband of 58 years, left a large void in her life, yet the warmth and smile on her face when she met you, never reflected the loneliness, pain and sorrow she felt deep down in her heart.

Her greatest pride in life were her children, grandchildren and great-grand children. There was always a photograph, a little snippet of news or an anecdote about them.

She was a true and loyal friend. Yet, she could be feisty and made sure you were aware of her views and opinions, on anything and everything that she did and did not agree on.

June was a very dear friend to my wife Shireen and me and not a day would go by without a call from her. The topics were varied and comprehensive, dealing with club issues, membership, members birthdays, anniversaries, and at times her woes with the computer.

You could depend on June to bring a plate of her famous 'Pol Sambol' sandwiches for all those setting up the hall on fund raising days. A caring gesture that was always very welcome and greatly appreciated. She also revelled in her role as emcee at the lunch functions. Having her burst into song was not uncommon, singing Happy Birthday to all those members celebrating the day. The list is endless and she will be greatly missed by all of us.

Curiously and contrary to her extrovert and effusive personality, her last stay in hospital, was conspicuous by her unusual request that she had no inclination to receive calls or visitors in hospital. She made these wishes very specific and clear to her children and family members. It was totally out of character for June to make such a decision, as she was always the first to send out Get Well cards, Birthday Cards and basically send cards and make phone calls for every occasion.


On reflection though, June was always one step ahead of all of us. HENRY LORRAINE BROHIER



Henry Lorraine Brohier 28 July 1931 - 11 May 2016

Henry's nickname from childhood was Chutta, meaning "small baby" in Sinhalese. For those who knew him, that was somewhat ironic given he was anything but small in character, generosity and spirit.

Born in Ceylon, the third of eight children, he was a loveable rascal with a penchant for fun and mischief, a streak, although mellowed over time, never really left him.

He met his wife Pam, when he was an altar boy at St. Lawrence' Church, Colombo. A love affair, not just with her, but also her whole family, who accepted him like their own. On completing his apprenticeship as a planter on a tea estate, he married her at the age of 25 and due to the changing political landscape in

Ceylon, they left for England, with their six month old daughter.

He worked tirelessly, at times holding three jobs to support his young family which by now had grown with the addition of two sons. He became an active member of the union movement, which was a sign of his desire to get involved and make a difference for himself and those of others.

Both Henry and his wife worked hard to keep the home fires burning and once again in the early 1980's, when they were both in their fifties, they made the very courageous decision to emigrate again, this time to Australia.

Henry made friends easily and would talk to anyone. He particularly wanted to encourage in young people the value of an education and was quick to recognize and encourage their potential. He is fondly remembered by many of them for his vision, faith and generosity to them.

In retirement, he involved himself in a number of community organisations. He took on positions of responsibility being twice president of the Eighty Club Melbourne, and a number of roles both in the operation and administration of Puffing Billy, which was a very important part of his life, particularly after the loss of his wife, Pam.

As well as being a choir member for 20 years at St John the Baptist Church, he was also a member of the Lions Club of Croydon and the Over 50's Club of Knox.

Henry had a very endearing sense of humour, one that was honed through his love of British comedy like Morcambe and Wise and The Two Ronnies. Fighting cancer and when he was about to undergo his first chemotherapy session, the nurse explained the process and potential side effects. On asking him whether there was anything he was concerned about – he looked at her, and said "Yes, there is one thing," – "What's that?" she asked and he replied, with a very solemn expression and tone – "I'm worried about losing my hair."

This was the essence of Henry. He surmounted every obstacle with courage, strength and perseverance. Most of all it was that mischievous streak, wit and humour, that endeared him to all.

My Friend – Henry Brohier

It was a pleasure to have known Henry Brohier, a privilege to have been his friend and an honour to have been considered by him as a friend.

He was a man with very high principles, whose honesty and integrity were beyond question. He was a very caring person, who was always ready to render assistance whenever and where ever it was required, as evidenced by his involvement in various community organisations such as The Puffing Billy Railway, The Lions Club of Croydon, The Over 50's Club of Knox and The Eighty Club of Melbourne where he served as President for two terms of office, during which his guidance and contribution to the Club were highly regarded.

He was a very religious man, and was not only a member of St. John the Baptist Church in Forest Road, Ferntree Gully, but also sang in the choir for the last 25 years.

He was also involved in providing financial support for the education of a girl in Sri Lanka, and prior to his demise, made arrangements to ensure that this financial assistance would continue as long as it was needed.

He was admired and respected by all who knew him and his demise was a sad and tragic loss to all of us.

We pray that God will bless him and that he will rest in peace.


It is no easy task, working towards the welfare of others, not to get emotionally involved in the pain and suffering, in the lives of those we seek to help. While we hasten to lend a hand to the poor and needy, there are times when we cannot help but shed a tear, feeling their misery and want. How much harder it must be to a mother, to see her son, a bright young man in the prime of his life, struck down by misfortune. One can only imagine her pain, tears, sorrow and her undying love as she tends his every need. The assistance he received through another organization had ceased and subsequently brought to the attention of the Eighty Club Melbourne.

This young man, Jude Reimers was immediately placed as a Welfare Beneficiary of the Club.

No words I can ever write can reflect or portray the eloquence, honesty and feelings of his mother, which I have taken the liberty of detailing below.

DEAR SIR, MADAM. I AM WRITING THIS LETTER ON BEHALF OF MY SON JAMIE JUDE REIMERS WHO MET WITH A ACCIDENT 16 YRS AGO AT THE AGE OF 18, HE IS BRAIN DAMAGED AND BED RIDDEN, DUE TO THE NEGLECT OF THE HOSPITAL HE HAD A BAD TIME OR BY NOW HE WOULD HAVE BEEN IN A BETTER POSITION, BUT AS WE ARE SIMPLE PEOPLE WE CANNOT BRING THIS TO ATTENTION, BUT OUR PRAYERS HAVE GIVEN HIM AND OUR FAMILY STRENGHT, I HAVE 4 CHILDREN, TWO GIRLS, JAMIE IS THE 310, MY YOUNGEST SON IS THE BREAD WINNER IN OUR HOME, I WAS A SINGLE MOTHER AND WE DIDNT HAVE MUCH, WENT THROUGH HARD TIMES AND THE CHILDREN WENT TO GOVERMENT SCHOOLS AND DID THEIR BEST, JAMIE WAS VERY GOOD IN SPORTS AND ON HIS WAY BACK FROM PRACTICE THIS SAD INCIDENT HAPPEN, WEARE A CLOSE FAMILY AND THATS WHAT REEPS US GOING, I WAS IN WATTALA BUT CAME TO STAY WITH MY YOUN GEST SISTER IN A RENTED HOUSE IN COLOMBO, THE OWNER HAVE BEEN VERY GOOD TO US, BUT THEY ARE GOING TO SELL THE HOUSE, I HAVE BEEN LOOKING AFTER JAMIE 24 hes, WASH, CLEAN, EXCESSE, CUT HIS HAIR, WASH HIM DAILY AND LOVE HIM DERY MUCH. A ORGANIRATION FROM THE D.B.Y. MAS BEEN HELPING JAMME FOR ABOUT 9 YIS BUT STOPPED FOR THE LAST 3 YRS DEAR SIR, MADAM. I HAD TO HAVE "A HIP AND KNEE REPLACEMENT 2 Yrs BACK BUT COULDN'T AFFORD IT AND COULDN'T LEAVE MY SON, BUT THINGS HAVE GOT WORSE AND I AM ON THE WAITING LIST FOR MAY ~

WORK PLACE AND THINGS ARE GOING TO BE DIFFICULT IN THE FUTURE, TILL I AM ON MY FEET, PLEASE DONT THINK I AM TRYING TO SHOW MY PRECIOUS SON AND MAKE MONEY, BUT I WOULD BE GRATEFUL IF I COULD HAVE SOME HELP TO LOOK AFTER MY SON, IN ANYWAY, ITS A BIT HARD WITH RENT AND EXPENSES, THE CHILDREN HAVE DELICATED THEIR LIFE FOR JAMIE AND ME AND I AM A LUCKY MUN, WE DONT LIKE TO WORRY OR THINK OTHERS HAVE TO DO ANYTHING FOR US, BUT THERE IS ONE PROMISE I WILL MAKE ON MY SON, IF I GET AND WHEN I GET A WAY OF STANDING ON MY FEET I WILL NOT TAKE ADVANTAGE OF UR KINDNESS. I AM SENDING ALL DETAILS I CAN, PLEASE UNDERSTAND I LOVE MY SON VERY MUCH, HE HAS GIVEN US THE BEST MEMORIES AND ALL HE WANTED WAS TO DO A JOB AND STOP ME WORKING, I HAVE NOT REGRETTED ANYTHING. 
