Christmas is a season of Joy, Belonging and Fun. A season of Warmth, Hope and a Season when everyone celebrates as One.

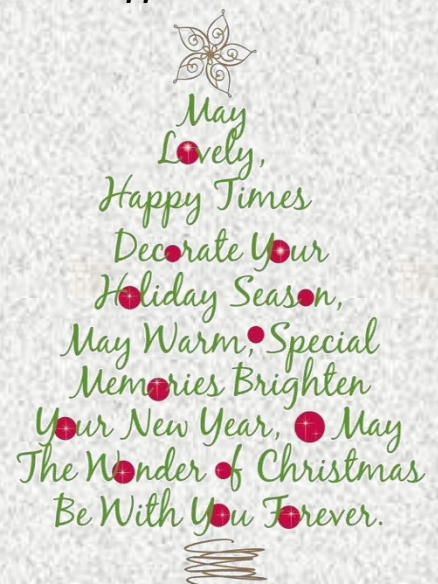

It continues to be a great pleasure to serve in a voluntary capacity as the Welfare Beneficiary Co-ordinator, an appointment that I take very seriously. I look forward to 2017 and hope that we could increase the number of WB's with the help of all our members and donations towards these less fortunate people.

It is with sadness that I read many stories from applicants being plunged into poverty due to lack of finances, sickness, accidents, old age or simply being born into poverty. Most people are unable to get any type of pension or assistance and struggle even to have a meal on a daily basis; purchase much needed medication or even have a permanent home to live in. Some of them are homeless and have a nomadic life going from home to home, of relatives and friends hoping to get a meal and shelter just for a night.

We are also faced with the challenge of making a choice as to who is most worthy to be taken on as a Welfare Beneficiary from the many applicants received. My feelings are always stretched to its limits when I have to choose who we take on in priority of need and who we keep on the waiting list, but the fact is that we cannot support all the people that apply.

Financially the cost of maintaining 200 Welfare beneficiaries, (of which 17 receive a family allowance and 32 receive a spouse allowance), requires the club to raise almost A\$20,000 every 3 months, in order to fund this scheme. The lower exchange rate to the dollar and the ever escalating costs of remitting these funds to Sri Lanka, puts further pressure to generate the income needed. Furthermore, as you peruse this newsletter, you realize the number of poor resorting to financial aid for various urgent reasons, have made more demands on the Emergency fund maintained by the club,

To all our members – In order that we continue to support these less fortunate people in Sri Lanka please look into your hearts and keep up the attendances at our lunches and bring along more friends and relatives. We have a great older generation who have supported the club over the years, it would be nice to welcome new members to our club especially the younger generation.

I wish all our members, friends and relatives a great Christmas and a Bright and Prosperous New Year

To document the plight of our Welfare recipients would fill many pages of our Newsletter and take too much of your time to peruse. However I would like to highlight the plight of WB, Mrs Nilmini de Fry, who having lost her husband and as a single mother has to support 3 children. Her eldest daughter suffers from depression and even though her other 2 children are on the ECM student Sponsorship scheme, life is daily struggle.



Nilmini however is an enterprising and hardworking mother, who does her best to sustain her family by working 3 days a week as a maid, sources scrap material to make carpets, pillow cases and wicks for small oil lamps, that she sells to the street markets. She still finds it difficult to make ends meet, due to the high cost of rent, school fees and food.

To her credit and persevering to better her circumstances, she has been given permission from the local authorities to sell her items as a street vendor, trading in the vicinity of 2 schools, a temple and a church.

To this end, she requires to build a portable cart, estimated to cost Rs 80,000 (approx \$800) to display and sell her wares and could even sell food items she makes. She believes that with this cart, and the assistance of her eldest daughter, (who cannot get employment), will make her more money than she earns presently and hopefully improve her present situation. The club has always encouraged and assisted such ventures to make our WB's self-reliant financially and we have asked the DBU for assistance, seeking clarification of cost in building the cart and to also monitor the progress of the cart to be built, in the event we were able to finance this project

The club has made provision for Rs.30,000 and we will endeavor to raise the balance funds needed for this project, to help fulfill her dreams and better her future.

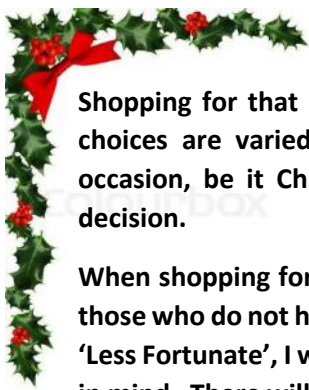

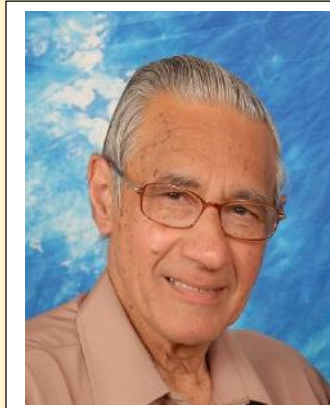
