

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The Easter holiday is a time that many of us would associate with hot-cross buns, chocolates and that cute Easter bunny.

The message of Easter however is one of renewal, new beginnings and hope, that the world could and should be a better place for all of us. This is what we all fervently wish for in our lives. To make our lives and all those around us better, is a goal we should all aspire to and is the most rewarding and fulfilling challenge we undertake in our lives



Recently, on a visit to Sri Lanka, I took the opportunity to visit the DBU in Colombo and visit a few of our Welfare Beneficiaries and Sponsored Students at their homes. Visiting the DBU on a few occasions, I was saddened and dismayed to see numerous people of the Burgher community seeking aid and assistance. They would patiently wait outside the office hoping that something could be done to ease their plight. Mrs. Etienne Jayatunga, (who coordinates our work at the DBU) would listen to them patiently and at the same time answer the numerous calls as to when the next payment date would be for the WB's and Sponsored Students. Visits to the homes of the WB's was an experience never to be forgotten. Even though these poor people, some of whom were living a life of abject poverty, others frail with ill health, mothers worrying about their children, there was a strange serenity about them. They would tell you all about their lives and their hopes that the future would bring them and their children a better life and yet, there was a calm philosophy and acceptance of their present circumstances. Perhaps all they had now was faith, prayer and trust that God would bless them in some way and see to their needs.

Visiting them, one realized that they looked to you with hope in their eyes and fact that someone cared enough to visit them. The words they had for all of you, were countless blessings and thanks for helping them. The hardest thing to do were to find words that would bring some comfort and ease the pain of their lives.

The plight of a family I visited was particularly sad and her story, with tears streaming down her face still remains with me and my wife. This lady, an orphan brought up in a convent, married with 3 daughters, the eldest 21yrs old (who works in a bookshop) and twin girls, 12 years of age. The father committed suicide some years ago and the mother was left to fend for her 3 children. Fate dealt a cruel blow, as one of the twin sisters was born with congenital birth defects, namely an imperforate anus and has undergone 8 operations to date to correct her bodily functions to secrete solid waste. The last operation to rectify this medical condition was unsuccessful leaving the little girl in constant pain and a life where she constantly needs her mother to help her on a daily basis, as she has a colostomy in place. One can only feel the pain of this little child and wonder what her future will be. One can also feel the pain of her mother who hides her sorrow and goes through life daily, wondering what the fate of her child will be. On the cover page of this Newsletter is a photograph of these young twin sisters, one healthy and normal and the other girl half her size, frail and sickly. A beautiful girl with pale brown eyes, who wants nothing more than to live a normal life, ride a bike and do the things young girls of her age would do.

These people, dear members and well-wishers are only a few of the many people we are able to help with your generosity. One can only wish and hope that the care we extend to these poor people can be extended to encompass more of the Less Fortunate in Sri Lanka. Please do keep up the good work, for it is only your compassion and kindness that helps to make their lives better and offer them hope for the future.

With this in mind, Shireen and I, together with the Management and Fund Raising Committees, would like to wish you all Peace, Joy, Happiness, the Hope of new beginnings that Easter brings to all of us, to all those that we help and plenty of colourful Easter Eggs.

This little shop is now completed and is parked beside a temple and school. She opens this shop every morning and evening, selling sundry items needed by temple goers and school children. She has a 3-4 km walk to get to the shop from her home.

STUDENT SPONSORSHIP NEWS - Letters from Our Sponsors

My greatest joy, visiting Sri Lanka was to meet my sponsored child for the second time. It has been nearly 3 years since I first met this lovely young girl, Taneya Hansey and her beautiful family. Since that life changing meeting and my first article, I have shared information about my visit and child sponsorship where ever there was an opportunity to let anyone know. As a result, I have been able to get some sponsors.

In November 2016, I went to India with my church. On the way back I arranged to drop into Sri Lanka and my dear church friend Ruth agreed to join me. She had never been to Sri Lanka before. This time I wanted to visit Taneya's school. It is hard to arrange anything because none of her immediate family speak English. Many thanks to Etienne from the DBU. I could not have arranged the visits without her help. She is a wonderful blessing.

We asked the hotel to arrange for a taxi with an English speaking driver.

Taneya's very large Catholic school holds 1,500 girls and the Principal is a nun. I was so happy when I finally saw Taneya who had grown a lot. Her school had finished for the day so I was shown her class which holds over 40 children with very old desks butted up together in long rows. There is a whiteboard and hardly any room to move. The room is divided in half for another class. I also got to meet some of her school friends and you get so much attention you feel like a rock star. All the girls are smiling and excited and asking you your name and where you are from. They loved having their photo taken in their long white uniforms and ties. I had taken kangaroo pins and hard lollies but had not realised she had so many in her class. I was able to take Taneya by taxi to her home with the driver translating. She now writes to me in Sinhalese and I get someone to translate and then I write in English and I get someone to write my letter in Sinhalese so we both understand each other.

Her little home which is a shack was flooded last year and they had to spend 2 months in a temple. They are now back and have lost so much. The water went up about 6 feet. It was so wonderful to see the family again and be able to pray for them. Desmond, Taneya's grandfather was there so he was able to translate. I went with some money from my parents, Aunt June and some from me. I was also able to take small presents for everyone this time.

I went to the DBU and met Etienne for the first time and saw the room where the Christmas party is held.

On the way home, the lady sitting next to me on the plane asked me why I went to Sri Lanka and I was able to share with her all about child sponsorship which she was interested in, so I took her details and let the club know.

I am writing this to encourage anyone who is not sponsoring a child to seriously consider helping a child who really needs our assistance. Since my teens, I have sponsored children through various organisations and what sets the Eighty Club Melbourne apart is that 100% of the sponsorship money goes to the child and the sponsorship amount is small. Even though I have not been working for over 6 months I see this as extremely important to continue to sponsor a child in Sri Lanka and as a way of showing God's love and compassion. I pray that you will view this as a very worthy cause to support.






