

## The Trials and Misfortunes of Janine P. - Student Sponsorship Program .

Janine is a 15 year old girl currently being sponsored by a very generous couple in Queensland. This sponsorship together with over 130 other students is administered for the ECM by the DBU in Colombo.





The sponsors present in the Banquet Hall of the hotel, did not reveal their presence to the family. The entire family was enthralled at the variety of food available and the father Mr. P. telephoned the DBU to say how much they enjoyed the meal. Mr. P. was fluent in English, both written and spoken, although his wife, of Burgher ancestry was not as conversant. Mr. P. who had a reasonable job as a Security Guard wrote informative letters giving news of the family and his children's progress in school. He always thanked the sponsors profusely for the support received to assist with the children's education. These letters, received by the Student Sponsorship Coordinator was redirected to the sponsors, complying with their wish to remain anonymous.

However the calm existence of the entire family was thrown into chaos in late 2005 when Mr. P passed away. Unable to cope, Mrs. P. suffered a nervous breakdown and was placed in a mental institution, where she underwent treatment and was released after a period of about 6 months. During this time and the subsequent times Mrs.P suffered a relapse, the children were placed in the care of neighbors and relatives.

Jason left school in 2014 when he was 17 and found employment as a casual labourer.

In 2016 further disaster overtook the family when their house was completely inundated and they took refuge in the local temple for two weeks till the flood waters receded. The family lost most of their possessions and Janine lost her school books and most of her clothes.

Sadly, after the father's death, the correspondence from the family was sporadic and the Administrative Manager of the DBU Mrs. Etienne Jayatunge kept the Sponsorship Coordinator informed as to the current situation, with regular e-mails which were forwarded to the sponsors. However we were unable to get an update on Janine's progress at school as her mother was unwell and was again an in-patient in an institution. The school authorities were not willing to provide any written information on Janine insisting that her mother present herself and request the information.

Unfortunately, due to the lack of correspondence and information from the school the sponsorship was suspended for the first two quarters of 2017. However it was restored in July 2017 when Mrs. P. was well enough to go to the school and obtain a written report on Janine's progress.

Everything was progressing well, the sponsorship restored and the sponsors were pleased with the updates. On receiving a letter from Janine in August 2017 they expressed their intention and desire to meet with Janine and her mother on their next visit to Sri Lanka in 2018; thus ending their anonymous status.

Fate however dealt a cruel blow and it was not long before Janine was once again subject to a great tragedy. In late September her mother, Mrs. P passed away after a short illness.

Janine has now been taken under the wing of her Aunt, her late father's sister and this lady has contacted the DBU and made arrangements to visit the DBU and meet with the Welfare Committee to discuss the way forward. Janine is scheduled to sit for her GCE "O" level examinations shortly. We wish her well.

Behind this unfortunate tale lies a background story of efficient information gathering coupled with great communication in keeping the Student Sponsorship Coordinator informed at every stage and thus the sponsor, of the events taking place (continued on next page)

in this young girl's life. The indefatigable and thoroughly dedicated efforts expended by Mrs. Etienne Jayatunge of the DBU, not just in this case but in all other student sponsorship matters requiring investigation are to be highly commended. It would have been impossible for Janine's sponsorship to continue without the regular updates from Etienne.

The Student Sponsorship Scheme would definitely not be functioning as well as it currently is without Etienne's support, dedication and efficiency. This sad and tragic story and how it was successfully managed in spite of many obstacles, clearly illustrates the importance and need for ongoing and regular communication between all parties – the students, the parents, the sponsors, the DBU and the ECM.

**UPDATE:** Young Janine P came on Saturday with her Aunt. She seems very composed and relaxed. Her Aunt informed us that her brother has now started working in a hotel in Negombo and Janine is studying for the GCE O/L exams this year. I was happy to see her.

Presently the DBU are getting ready for a concert with Ishan Bahar to collect funds for the children who complete A/Ls and want to pursue their studies. Last year too with the monies so collected, we were able to sponsor a few children, some, who are still continuing with their studies and some who have already completed. In fact we were very proud to read in the newspapers only last week of one of these children successfully completed a course at Prima Bakery and is doing well for herself. This Bakery course costs approx. Rs.250,000 and recognized worldwide – which is saying something. If not that the DBU stepped in to help her she would have not had this opportunity. This goes for the Eighty Club Melbourne as well. If not for all the help the Eighty Club Melbourne gives our young ones they would not have been able to reach the A/L! Most of the parents realize this and are very appreciative of the quarterly allowance they receive from the Club. Etienne Jayatunga.



## **HELP - NEW SPONSORS NEEDED**

The students currently under sponsorship number 131 in Colombo and 36 in Batticaloa.

We have two (02) students both girls currently in school whose sponsors have reluctantly withdrawn their support due to financial reasons.

In addition fourteen students (14) have sat for their GCE "A" Level examinations and are awaiting the results. It is possible that of these 14 students 4 or 5 may continue to do tertiary studies and the balance will leave school.
