STUDENT SPONSORSHIP NEWS

The student sponsorship scheme continues to grow and it is really satisfying to see a student complete their secondary schooling and progress to further tertiary studies or gain employment.

Sponsors are to be thanked for their ongoing support and generosity; if not for your sponsorship it is unlikely that the students would have progressed to the extent that they have when their sponsorship ceases.

Elsewhere in the Newsletter you will read about the scheme to assist all students at "A" level by conducting a seminar where they will be shown how to prepare a resume, apply for suitable employment, attend an interview and conduct themselves at an interview. This seminar has been conducted in Batticaloa with outstanding results. We are currently in the process of setting up a similar scheme in Colombo in partnership with the DBU.

Currently there are 130 students being sponsored in the Colombo area with 18 of them at "A" level .Batticaloa has a total of 37 sponsored students with 14 at "A" level and 03 students undertaking tertiary studies.

The DBU has scheduled the 4th quarter's payment for the 27th October and Batticaloa will be paying their students on the 3rd November. As I will be in Sri Lanka during this time I intend to be present for both these occasions.

VISION FOR THE FUTURE PROJECTS

CATARACT SURGERY.

Arrangements are being made between the DBU and the Sight First Hospital in Hendala, Sri Lanka to carry out cataract operations on welfare beneficiaries who need them. Sean Van Dort from the DBU has already visited the hospital and is making arrangements for the first group of welfare beneficiaries to be transported to the hospital for treatment in the next few weeks.

The cost of each cataract operation is approx. \$100.00 which also includes the cost of assessment for surgery, medications and transport.

We are hopeful that this will be an ongoing project and the Club looks forward to your support for any amount you wish to donate towards this cause.

SCHOOL LEAVERS - YEARS 10 or 12.

A proposal to conduct seminars to assist school leavers prepare a resume in English as well as in Sinhalese to assist them in seeking employment is to be implemented, early 2019 with the help of the DBU in Colombo.

Sean Van Dort who will coordinate this project has agreed to get a resource manager/coordinator to make these presentations free of charge.

Total cost is estimated to be around \$300.00.

Trevor Collette as Student Sponsorship Coordinator will assist in coordinating this project.

EMPLOYMENT FOR SCHOOL LEAVERS.

A project to help students who complete their education, to find employment, was started in May 2018 and we have been successful in finding employment for a student who finished her A/Level exams over two years ago but was unable to find employment.

Students are required to write to their sponsors as to their progress and I do appeal to the sponsors to keep track and inform us of the student who finish their education, so that we may be able to help them with finding employment or helping with their further studies. This information will help us correlate information we receive on students from the DBU.




