WELFARE BENEFICIARY NEWS - Shireen Ferdinand & Yvonne de Vos- WB Coordinators.

This article from Mrs. Etienne Jayatunga, DBU, Colombo says it all.

Whoever thought that we would be subject to virtually a world-wide lockdown! But it did happen and we are all reeling with the after effects!

In Sri Lanka, it was curfew for nearly 75 days which meant that the daily wage earner was unable to go out to earn a living. Families were starving. I telephoned a few of them, most of whom were single mothers, and their stories were pathetic. One mother who had five teenagers was at home without work and no money. When I called she said she was seated and wondering how she was to buy some groceries to feed her brood! In addition she was faced with the problem of keeping all five children inside the confines of her small home, as the Police was quite strict in enforcing the curfew. When I inquired from another Mother how she was managing she said that she was plucking the jak fruits from her garden and she and her two children were surviving on that as she had no money to buy anything for the family! Thank God she had even a jak tree! Nilmini, who has three children, was at home desperate with no money to buy any food. When I inquired from a WB if she was ok, her reply was – I'm ok, but not enough food! This coming from an 80 year old was very, very sad. Just a few days ago, after the curfew was lifted, one Mr. B. visited the office and informed me that he, his wife and three children were starving. He was a daily paid worker and he had no work for the past three months. He was desperate and visited the office to check if any of his children's applications had been approved for sponsorship.

We at the DBU always respond and give those in need something before they leave. I am grateful to the Eighty Club for the Emergency Fund that is always available for such a time as this. Even during the curfew we braved the virus and sent out all the monies to our 750 welfare recipients and we are deeply grateful to all those who have sponsored and supported our various welfare schemes, especially to the Eighty Club.

Our Government did distribute Rs.5,000 to each family that was in need, but it was not easy to obtain this as various criteria had to be fulfilled.

Some countries are still in lockdown, but thankfully Sri Lanka handled the COVID-19 well and we are slowly but surely getting back to normal.

Thank you Eighty Club for generously coming to the aid of our WBs, even when things are difficult all around the world. On behalf of the DBU I send you my heartfelt thanks and wish your organization continued strength in the years to come.

Mrs Jean don Paul and husband. Have 2 daughters and 2 sons. Sons work as labourers and they are not in a position to help. A little assistance from one daughter who lives close by. May have to vacate their tiny home as the owner wants the house back. Both applicants are suffering from Diabetes and high blood pressure and need medication. Husband is 70yrs of age and tries to make ends meet by doing odd jobs.
