President's Message - Earle Ferdinand

The unprecedented humanitarian crisis in Sri Lanka is common knowledge to all. People from all walks of life, irrespective of age, religion or ethnicity, have come together in protest, calling for a change in government and demanding solutions to combat the spiraling cost of living and the shortages of food, energy and medicines. These shortages pose the very real threat of starvation to a population of 23 million. To a cash strapped nation, the reliance on imported food and energy supplies, is a major concern.

Parallel to the mass of protestors young and old seeking change, are the snaking queues of despondent people encircling the country, desperate to purchase fuel, gas or any other essentials, they so urgently require. Since it's independence, there has never been a more desperate time in Sri Lanka, than now.

The country is once again enforcing lockdowns, this time to combat shortages of fuel, transport and the economic crisis. Bread-winners unable to work or ply their trade as they are unable to travel to work. Schools are closed and online learning an impossibility as rolling power blackouts, are the norm. This ongoing and protracted socio-economic crisis will ultimately mean that without work, families will starve, unable to provide food on the table or tend to the basic needs of their children.

Sri Lanka today, is dependent on aid from other countries and all other disasters, be it the tsunami, pandemic, other natural disasters or even three decades of civil war, pale in comparison.

As always, we need to continue our aid and in every way we can alleviate the suffering of these poor people. We surely can and should, help care for the poorest of the poor. These are the people who suffer the most. With nowhere and nothing to turn to, they are helpless and depend on the charity of others. Lack of food only leads to malnutrition with their frail bodies trying to cope. Ravaged by hunger, they ultimately fall ill or suffer with medical issues. With no money or resources to seek medical attention, their plight is compounded by the fact that there are no medicines available.

My urgent plea is to ask each and every one of you to donate as much as you can, together with your payment of the Annual Membership Subscriptions due in July. Your generosity is essential to care for these poor people. Their blessings to you will echo in their prayers, thanking all of you for your help, in their time of need. Our work never ends, even though we would all earnestly wish and pray that we can eradicate poverty in our lifetime.

There has been many a time that I have felt helpless, seeing the suffering of these poor people and I always endeavored and did my best to do more. I have met many of them and listened to the sad stories of their lives. Covid did stop me and my wife from visiting them in SL, however they are not forgotten and never will be. The ultimate joy in life is to share your good fortune with others, specially the needy.

Given the circumstances and my compassion for these poor people, it is indeed with a certain amount of guilt and anguish, I would like to inform all of you, that at the next Annual General Meeting, scheduled for August this year, I will be stepping down as President of this great Club. This has not been a decision taken lightly, however I am sure the time is right to hand over and ensure the continuance of our work and the Club. Rest assured I leave the Club in good hands and I am confident that my successor will also work tirelessly for the poor and under-privileged.

Every President is only as good as the Committee, he is privileged to work with and in my 8 years, the unstinting support and help I have received from all of them are memories to be cherished forever. My unmitigated and Sincere Thanks to all of them for their friendship, dedication and work ethic in a voluntary role. Together, this has been a journey that surpasses everything I have done so far.

Last but not least, where will this great club be without you, our members, sponsors and well-wishers. Your compassion and generosity to the Less Fortunate has and always will be, the greatest asset any charitable organization can ever have. I hold in high esteem your support over the years and in my term as President. There are no words to convey my thoughts and sentiments to Thank You enough.

Finally, I do not intend to spend my senior years in 'God's waiting room' and will continue to serve on the Committee, continue the mission of the Club and help the 'Less Fortunate'. Thank You.

WELFARE BENEFICIARY NEWS - Shireen Ferdinand



These are the faces of despair and pain in Sri Lanka today.

Over the years they have faced many hardships, but perhaps never a situation like they face today. Looking to end their pain and suffering, they take to the streets in protest. Pots and pans that would normally be used to prepare a meal are now clanging away to draw attention to high prices and lack of food. Aptly, they call it the 'Kitchen Lament'. Kitchens with empty cupboards and no food to feed hungry stomachs. At times, all they have to share with their children is a meal of boiled rice with coconut or whatever vegetables they are fortunate to access and afford. These are the facts of life in Sri Lanka, today, easily accessed from news reports, YouTube or any other media reports. These days a 'Tuk Tuk driver is not looking for passengers, instead pushing their vehicles in a long queue to find fuel. Workers risking life and limb to cling onto trains to get to their place of work and others with no hope in sight resting their bodies on an empty container, looking for fuel.

Every application for Welfare Beneficiary aid is a story of hardship, poverty and a plea for financial aid. They are all deserving and it is impossible to prioritize, those that are most deserving. Their pleas for help are a plaintive cry reaching out to all of us, in their time of need.

If the prices of goods are any indication, they need all the help they can get. Even with the escalating prices of

food and essentials in Australia, we are fortunate to be able to lead a good life. How can an aged person in Sri Lanka with no income, unable to work, no pension or social assistance and living on the poverty line, manage the rising cost of living and pay for food, lodgings and medical expenses? Regrettably and in all honesty the money they receive from us will not go a long way. While we work hard through our fund-raising

efforts to lift their standard of living, we are well aware that we also need to increase our quarterly aid to them. Presently all we can do to help our WB's is to supplement their income with an additional bonus payment. This year, I hope once again that you will dig deep and help us to continue our humanitarian work, fund our commitment to the WB's and enable us to add on an extra Mid-year and Christmas bonus.

My message to you, is to plead on their behalf.

My sincere thanks to all those who brought smiles to the faces of young students and for a brief moment in time eased the burden of their parents, by donating generously towards the appeal for the families of sponsored students to help

them with the rising cost of living in Sri Lanka, at a time when the country is at its worst economic crisis. Your response was a gratifying expression of caring for these young students and their families.

In a short time, thanks to all of you a sum of \$12,000 was raised and together with a

supplement from the Club finances, each of these families received a payment of Rs.30,000. No doubt, this will go a long way to help them in many ways and more importantly, they will be able to purchase food and rations to feed their children. One can only wonder what the future holds for these children and we can only hope and pray that the smiles that light up their faces, continues on.

The gratitude of their parents is humbling and I can only insert a few of their messages to you. One such message was from the mother of Calvin Anderson, pictured here. Calvin, born with a curvature of the spine was helped in the past with surgery to correct the problem which was only partly successful. Thanks to his sponsor, he was able to attend the Deaf and Blind School in Ratmalana and now, he is considered not eligible as he is subject to fits. Calvin now needs full time care and as his situation is well known to the Club, we have transferred his status from

sponsored student to a Welfare Beneficiary, This will ensure that his mother will receive ongoing payments to help care and provide for him. In other news, students sitting the GCE(OL) examinations, had to combat heavy rains, flooding and in one particular exam center a leaking roof and with rain beating through an open window, they sat their exam with an open umbrella over their heads and desk. With no fuel or transport, many students had to walk miles to their exam centers. Flooded roads meant some students had to be ferried across these roads in rubber dinghies operated by the navy. Other children were literally carried across in order to keep them dry. GCE(AL) level exams scheduled for August have also been postponed. The pictures say it all


Thank You to Cynthia Mortier


