

WELFARE BENEFICIARY NEWS

It was not long ago that we were planning our Christmas celebrations or perhaps a holiday after years of Covid and lockdowns. These thoughts were far from the minds of those in Sri Lanka. Their lives, were a daily fight for survival with food and fuel shortages, skyrocketing prices and no hope for the future. Months have gone by as we move into Easter 2023 and to say that their lives have improved is far from the truth.

The poor are still struggling to have 3 meals a day and the cries for help grow by the day. This year, thanks to all of you, we are increasing the number of Welfare Beneficiaries to 215 (an addition of 15 more WB's).

The committee has also decided to increase their quarterly allowances by Rs.3000. Single WB's now receive Rs.12,000, a couple Rs.15,000 and families Rs 18,000.

While we do our very best to increase our aid to these poor suffering people, we also have to be mindful that our fund-raising events have only been a partial success due to the high cost of hosting these events and the reduction in the number of attendees. Regrettably as our members get older and they are compelled to move into retirement or aged care, it is understandable that there are very little funds left for charitable purposes.

As time goes by, as with any charity, the club and those in Sri Lanka, have to depend on your donations and goodwill. We are indeed grateful for your support and caring and just as the poor in Sri Lanka look forward to your aid, the club too depends on your generosity. Every little bit helps, be it a jar of coins collected or a donation in lieu of gifts for a birthday

STUDENT SPONSORSHIP NEWS - Trevor Collette

It was indeed a sad day to be present at the funeral services of Maurice Forster. Listening to the eulogies, it was evident that he was a man of great generosity and vision. It would take too may pages to condense all that he achieved, both in his personal and working life. Maurice had a vision that the best way to break the cycle of poverty was to educate the children of poor families. It is indeed a testament to his legacy, that he achieved his goals in many ways. Maurice started the Student Sponsorship Scheme on his own and as the project grew, he combined this scheme with the work of the Club. He was a past President of the ECM, SSP coordinator and continued to devote his considerable energy to the welfare of poor students.

I was fortunate to understudy his work and as his health deteriorated, took over from him as SSP coordinator. However, he was always keen to lend a helping hand or give advice on how we could extend and improve the program. I am sure he would take pride in the story below of a family doing their best not only to better their lives, but also caring for each other in every way and rising above the adversities that life had dealt them at

an early age.



Ishani

Ishani Vancuylenberg, a single Mum, was left to fend for 5 children, by working as a maid and selling king coconuts and betel leaves on the roadside. Her children were fortunate to receive sponsorship through the Club SSP. Her eldest daughter Sonali, although initially wanting to become a nun, decided to enroll in the army after completing her GCE (AL) exams. She knew this would help the family. I now quote Etienne from the DBU who says "

Ishani Vancuylenberg told me that if they have a laptop it would come in very useful so I gave her one of the refurbished ones, sent by the Club. She was very grateful and you will be surprised to hear that she too is studying for an external degree at the Sri Jayawardenepura University. She is 43 years old and keeps the family going by working as a Maid in houses. I thought it was very creditable. The lady for whom she works had helped her to obtain her certificates and to apply and she was accepted by the University. She is doing her studies online. Her daughter in the Army and is doing well, but earns a salary of Rs.35,000 pm. Her eldest son is doing a Hybrid Motor Mechanics course at Wayamba Technical College in Kurunegala and he has to pay Rs.15,000 pm to the College. In addition, he has to pay for his food which is Rs.450/= per day. According to her he cannot afford the 3 meals and has only his dinner! If there is any way we could help this family it will be great". looking at helping this young boy and we would welcome any help to see this young lad prosper in life.



On a further note, young Elin van Langenberg has secured a placement in the Kelaniya University and was presented a laptop by Sean van Dort, donated by the Maroondah Rotary Club, Melbourne. Elin is also joining an English course which is being sponsored through the DBU and will commence in April 2023. Her English is not bad, but she is very shy to speak, so this should help her to be more confident. She will be better equipped for a job once she completes her University studies education and also attains fluency in English.


