WELFARE BENEFICIARY NEWS - Shireen Ferdinand



Amidst all the wars, atrocities and inhumane acts committed in many parts of the world today, one can only hope and pray that soon there will be an end to all hostilities. As always, it is the innocent and children who suffer most. The loss of loved ones, parents, siblings and even the family home can be traumatic. It may be a simplistic view, but the cost of war would feed many who are starving. To those, coping with their personal and family tragedies, it can be a daunting and challenging future.

I am mindful and thankful to many of you who came to the aid of young Sonali Vancuylenberg and donated generously. Together with Club funds and your contributions, we were able to send her mother over \$1000 to help this family in the short term. Unfortunately, Sonali has been

informed that she will have to resign her commission from the army. This young girl, who struggled against odds, persevered and was the breadwinner of the family, in the prime of her life is now left bereft of a future and once again the family is struggling to cope. Sonali has a long road ahead of her medically. **The Club has decided to approve her mother, Ishani as a Welfare Beneficiary** and hopefully the funds she receives will help with the living costs of the family and fund any medical assistance, that Sonali requires in the future.

On a brighter note, coming into the season of Christmas, the Committee has approved, a proposal made by our Treasurer, Tony Scarnivel, to increase the WB allowance to Rs15,000/qtr. This will be the 2nd increase to the WB allowance this year, an additional Rs6000 from the former quarterly allowance of Rs9000. A dependent spouse or child will also receive an additional Rs1000 each. This will help them in great measure to cope with the high cost of living in Sri Lanka. We have also approved 15 more deserving applicants as Welfare beneficiaries, which brings us now to a total of 215 WB's in Colombo and Batticaloa.

All this aid, is only possible because of you. The need to raise approximately \$100,000 every year to fund our commitments to these WB's is a formidable task. However it is a challenge we will overcome with your support and help.

Your generosity knows no bounds and I do know that many of you, with your donations, forgo a few luxuries in your personal

lives to 'Care for the Less Fortunate'.
Your caring and kindness is the one true motivator for all of us, to continue on with the work we do and hopefully we can achieve more, looking to the future. There are many more applicants, who are deserving and waitlisted on our files. They need our help and we must continue to help them. Once again, THANK YOU.

Together with Yvonne de Vos (Asst, WB coordinator), we wish you all a Merry Christmas, filled with Peace Joy and every Blessing that the season brings and every Good Wish for the New Year.

Eighty Club student begins new business – The story of Nicoli Perera



In 2017 on a visit to Sri Lanka, I visited young Nicoli Perera at her home in Panadura, (pictured here with her twin sister). The Club, with the help of a sponsor, helped Nicoli, many years ago after she lost her father, the family bread-winner, under tragic circumstances. Compounding the personal difficulties of the family, Nicoli has a very serious medical condition. A series of operations has only been partially successful, and the condition will affect her for the rest of her life. In



comparison to her twin, side-by-side, the toll taken on her is tragically obvious.

Efforts to bring her over to Australia for surgical intervention were unsuccessful. A former student sponsored through the Eighty Club, Nicoli is now a beautiful young teenager, who loves music and dancing. Nicoli has refused to succumb to adversity and wants to be independent, self-sufficient and successful. She has started a new business from home, making decorated flip-flops. With your help and that of the Club, it will definitely take off and more-over give her a sense of satisfaction, purpose and a positive outlook to life.

Because of her particularly dire circumstances, the Club and sponsor, went beyond the normal period of student sponsorship, to give Nicoli a little extra help. One member recently donated \$100 to help kick-start her new business, which she's operating from home with her twin and elder sister (both were sponsored through the Club, as students). They used the donation to buy the raw materials to make the decorated flip-flops, which are apparently, quite popular in Sri Lanka at the moment. It was enough for them to get the basic equipment and make a few dozen pairs, one of which can sell for about Rs 900, or a little over \$4. Self sufficiency is the key in all our lives and this year give Nicoli and her family the perfect gift, by contributing to the aspirations of this young girl and her entrepreneurial vision


