Yes, there are many over there who will not be able to afford all the trappings of the season. For these poor people the luxury hotels overflowing with bookings, the Christmas decor and the majestic fare served in the restaurant and food outlets are totally beyond their imagination or wildest dreams. Christmas revelers will pay exorbitant prices to party and dance the night away on Christmas and New Years eve and as we all know they will party into the early hours of the following morning. Many of us, migrants living abroad, may even make the journey to fly over and meet with friends, family and enjoy the unique Sri Lankan hospitality.

A time to think about those of our community, living in poverty, eking out an existence and depending on the charity of others to face another day.

STUDENT SPONSORSHIP NEWS - A GLIMPSE OF OUR SPONSORS - Trevor Collette

FORREST & JOHN WOODBURY

The Woodburys have sponsored students in Sri Lanka for many years and currently sponsor a girl, Deiny in Batticaloa. Responding to a letter from Deiny, Forrest outlined her life story in which she revealed her Sri Lankan heritage.

We have reproduced relevant portions of Forrest's letter to help introduce a generous sponsor to our members.

"John is an Australian, but I was born and raised in Sri Lanka, mainly in Colombo. When I was 11 years old my mother decided it would be best to migrate to Australia. My mother's parents, my mother and my brother who was 7 years old at the time left Colombo in December 1955 to travel to Perth, where my mother's younger sister and husband were living.

Attending school in Australia was interesting and the subjects studied were similar to those in Sri Lanka. Mathematics was challenging as the Australian Currency at that time was pounds, shillings and pence, (in line with English currency). I was used to the easier decimal currency of Rupees and Cents. I had completed Standard 6 in Colombo, but had to study at that level again in Australia, which was good as it gave me the chance to learn all the new aspects of the various subjects. Studying, through High School and then progressing to Teachers' College, I became a High School teacher, teaching business subjects such as Shorthand, Typewriting and Accounting.

My husband, a teacher too, chose to teach in Primary School. We continued teaching in Perth and were blessed with our first child, a daughter named Whitney in 1969, and our son Shannon in 1971. In 1975 we moved south of Perth to Albany as we decided to start our own camp school. This is a school where children from other schools visit for a week at a time, live in dormitories and study nature - the beach and oceans, country towns, native bush areas and the animals of the bush. In 1980 we decided we wanted to start our own primary school as well and this school is still operating. We also had our third child, a girl we named Samantha. Resigning from the primary school in 2003 and we bought a catamaran yacht and ventured into whale watching tours from Albany harbor, until 2018 when we retired.

Australia has been a very wonderful place to live and work and we have enjoyed each moment, everything and all we have achieved.

A planned to visit Sri Lanka with my brother and his wife, in 2020, was cancelled due to the Covid pandemic, which made travel impossible. I have never been back to Sri Lanka and would love to visit.

I have very strong and fond memories of my life in Sri Lanka. We lived in Colombo, but my Dad lived and worked for many years in Yala, in charge of the Yala National Wildlife Park.

I remember visiting Palutupana, Kandy and Polonnaruwa, also holidaying in Bandarawela and Haputale.

We are delighted to be able to send money back to Sri Lanka to help young people study and get a good education through the Student Sponsorship Program. Hopefully, they will be able to get good jobs when they grow up. We do hope you are enjoying your school days and that you study hard to do well. Do maintain your knowledge of the English language as it is spoken all over the world and will be of immense help if you travel overseas when you are an adult.

On our visit to Sri Lanka in August, we were fortunate to be on the East Coast in Passikadu and only 30km away from the family of our sponsored student Joisin Barthelot who lives in Batticaola. With the help of the DBU, Mr Terry Stockvus arranged an interpreter – a lovely girl call Joiclyn who was fluent in English (as her very clever father suggested she study in the English stream) and was able to negotiate the conversation so that we had a pleasant visit and actually connected with this family. I hadn't realized their first language spoken was Tamil.

As we found out, the Barthelot family were severely affected by the 2004 Tsunami. Not only did they loose their home, but Joisin's father lost both his parents and his brother. The SL government then resettled all those displaced families closer to Batticaola where new homes were built for them.

Joicin is 15 and has a passion for Baila dancing. Her team had entered a competition run by the DBU and they were the winners. We coaxed her into showing us all her moves and her little sister and mum also joined in. The family was extremely hospitable and we were treated to some delicious sweet treats and farewelled off with a bag of goodies to take back to our friends.

We were very grateful to have had this opportunity to meet and make a proper connection with this family and look forward to following Joicin's progress.
