Dear Members, Friends and Well-wishers

We were born, created, inaugurated – call it what you will – in 1982. We started with 25 members, today we number 497. We assist 160 families, paying Rs.500 a month. In addition sponsors aid 79 children with an education. To date Rs.8,200,000 million has been remitted to Sri Lanka. We have refused to be insensitive. This is LOVE at work.

There are those, in their selfish lives, who regard the poor, the unfortunate a hindrance an obstacle to be avoided. They go their uncaring ways with no feeling towards people with weathered faces, tattered clothing, struggling to put food on the table. They refuse to be involved. If that is all we have no quarrel. But .....

We had a giitch in March this year and some sorry creatures surfaced –

“Sue the 80 Club” – take food away from the hungry?

“They are a Club of Beggars. Don’t give”, - deny the needy?

We countered this vilification with a dedication to carry on. We give hope where there is despair.

The faithful gave us strength.

“Wherever good is done, you will find Satan lurking” said Barbara, a member.

“Don’t lose faith. Only good can come from this” echoed Godwin, her husband.

The Rev. Lawrence Turnbull of St. David's Church, Moorabbin, together with our Rev. Crosbie de Kretser and Mrs Ishbelle Poppenbeck at the organ (both Club members) held a healing service attended by 80 members. It was a memorable evening of songs of praise, followed with bible readings, prayers and ministerial words of upliftment and renewal of spirit. Members were visibly moved when invited to say why they became members of the Club and continued to support and work as volunteers. Ministerial words of upliftment followed, with the theme of not giving up, but to put the past events behind each one of us and be renewed with a determination that this work of Christian charity must not be allowed to falter or fail. We departed soothed, comforted and refocused to this important task of charity abroad.

The next event was our Buriyani luncheon in May where a gathering of 268 members and supporters sat down to a sumptuous meal. In July another 260 members and well-wishers enjoyed a Stringhopper luncheon provided by Victor and Loraine de Silva of Zodiac Catering. Victor and Loraine are members of the Club.

The Committee is heartened by these declarations of loyalty, which guarantee that our needy pensioners will receive the monies they eagerly await. The Committee, urges that all members commit themselves to attending our various functions and get-togethers. We need your presence to make up the anticipated deficit in funds.

Some members have asked the question. "Why should a single member pay the same subscription as that of a family?" It must be stressed that this is not a Social Club. We raise funds for charity abroad. It is a Charitable Institution. Consider your contribution of \$2.50 a month as a donation, not a subscription. The money goes to support the disadvantaged. Your money helps feed the hungry in Sri Lanka.

### Our Child Sponsorship Scheme by Vernon Kelly

This scheme is now operationally sound with the co-operation of the DBU and the work of their social welfare representative, Anthea Muller. Currently 79 children are sponsored and the number of sponsors is 65. The children range in age from 4 years to 17 years.

Currently sponsors allocated a child, pay \$33 per quarter to ensure a monthly payment for the child of Rs.400 in the case of a child up to 15 years. Children over 15 years and up to 18 years, are ensured a monthly payment of Rs.600, for which the sponsors volunteered to pay \$45 per quarter.

Anthea Muller is doing a tremendous job in visiting children in their homes and at their schools to ensure that the allowances are properly utilised for their education. Also any special educational necessities of these children are met by her from monies sent by the Club. In 1998, a sum of \$500 was sent for this purpose. In 1999 Dr Clifford Misso, member and eminent retired surgeon, made a donation of \$730 = Rs 32,661 for an identical purpose in celebration of his 90<sup>th</sup> birthday. Thank you Dr Clifford Misso for this fine gesture to these poor children. A very practical and meaningful expression of caring for the younger members of our community who require assistance for their educational needs. Anthea's considerable expenses in travelling, phone calls and other demands had been generously covered by a donor in Sri Lanka. However, from May 1999, the sponsorship scheme has to meet these expenses. Anthea's work is essential to the satisfactory operation of the scheme. Arising from the favourable exchange rates prevailing, a reserve fund has been created here to meet exchange rate fluctuations and any special emergencies in Sri Lanka and to cover any delays in receipt of sponsorship monies from donors. We also pay into this reserve, donations received from people not requiring to be allocated a child, but support the scheme as a good cause.

To continue meeting Anthea's out of pocket expenses (telephone calls and visiting children/parents, etc.) we are requesting sponsors to consider increasing their contributions from \$33 per quarter to \$35 and those paying \$45, for the senior students, to increase their support to \$47 per quarter. Can you help to assist Anthea with her out of pocket expenses?

Maurice Forster who launched the scheme in 1996 is now taking a well-earned rest up North with his family. He returns to the task in September.

Club funded Aerogrammes with sponsor's address at no cost to the children/parents will be given out at the DBU on Saturday 7 August, to parents, enabling regular communication with sponsors in Australia. This will be done each quarter in November, February, May and August. Contact Maurice Forster (9841 8749) or in his absence, Vernon Kelly (9843 9649) should there be communication breakdown. Each Aerogramme in Sri Lanka costs Rs20 – an unfair impost on struggling parents – hence the Club's decision to pay for these Aerogrammes.






### Members on the move.
